#### Jigsaw



The Jigsaw is the most used power tool in woodworking. It is an essential power saw for cutting wood. It consists of a small length blade that is replaceable. The blade comes with different teeth arrangements to be used for different purposes. It works in a reciprocating mechanism, ie the blade moves up and down continuously to cut through the material.

The jigsaw can be corded and cordless. The cordless ones are more flexible and versatile to use.. Jigsaws are used for cutting out shapes on wood pieces and also cutting different stencil patterns. It can cut from different angles. Mitre joints can be made using a jigsaw.

#### Chocolate Peanut Cluster Cookies

1 cup chocolate chips 1/4 cup peanut butter 1 cup dry roasted peanuts

Makes 30

Melt chocolate chips over a double boiler or in microwave.

Drop small spoonfuls onto oven tray lined with baking paper. Chill until firm for about 1 hour.
